Decision, right to appeal and legal remedies	If the data subject's request is granted, the requested data and a copy of this form will be provided to him/her.
Tomesace	If the data subject's request is refused in whole or in part, he/she will be provided with the official's decision stating the grounds for the refusal and a copy of this form. A decision made by an official may be appealed to the Parliamentary Office Commission.
	The data subject has the right to file a complaint with a supervisory authority if he/she considers that the processing of his/her personal data violates the data protection regulation. In Finland, the supervisory authority is the Data Protection Ombudsman. This right is not restricted by the aforementioned right to appeal against a decision made by an official.
